Space will be held on a tentative basis for you when reserving a trip. We reserve the right to cancel your reservation if payment is not received in a timely manner.

Deposits & Cancellations:

Since we are obligated to make financial commitments to my suppliers prior to a tour's departure <u>based on your</u> <u>anticipated participation</u>, we have instituted the following reservation & cancellation policies:

Daytrips: Full payment is due 45 days prior to the trip, and is Refundable up to 14 days prior to the trip

Daytrips with ticketed events (theatre, show, or ballgame): Shows under \$100 require full payment to reserve, shows over \$100 require \$75 per person to reserve Balance is due 60 days prior to the trip and is Non-refundable unless vourticket is resold

Overnight motorcoach trips:

\$75 per person deposit to reserve space. Balance is due 45 days prior to departure.

Payments are refundable up to 30 days prior to departure.

Overnight motorcoach trips with ticketed events (theatre, show or ballgame):

A \$100 per person, non-refundable deposit is required to reserve. Balance is due 60 days prior to the trip

Deposit will be refunded if your ticket is resold, and the balance is refundable up to 31 days prior to departure

For longer overnight trips & cruises, and trips including airfare – please check the individual fliers for deposit and cancellation policies

TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE is available for all trips. For daytrips, insurance is \$7 per person for all trips that do not involve theater. Theater daytrip's insurance cost is \$14 per person. All multi-day trip insurance costs are dependent on the cost of the trip and your age. Please call us for more information.

Pickup locations:

Our Hyannis pickup is at the commuter lot behind Burger King at exit 6 off Route 6. This is NOT the Burger King parking lot, as they will tow any vehicles left there for an extended time. Park in the commuter lot and wait at the enclosures for the bus – please be sure that you are parked in a legal parking spot – if you are on the grass or outside of the marked parking spots, you will be issued a parking citation. The police patrol this lot and will ticket/tow any car that is parked illegally. As always, parking is at your own risk at any of our pickup locations.

- 1. Patriots Square, Route 134, Dennis
- Barnstable Commuter lot, Route 132, Hyannis if you find that there are no remaining legal parking places, please proceed to either Sagamore or Dennis (if you have time) to meet the bus – do NOT go to the Hyannis Transportation Center
- 3. Sagamore Commuter lot, at the foot of the Sagamore Bridge

Your requested pickup location will be printed on your sales receipt or invoice. <u>Please arrive at least 10 minutes prior to</u> the departure time and call the office if you decide to change to a different pickup location.

Assigned Seating - In the interest of fairness to those boarding in Hyannis & Sagamore as well as our handicapped passengers, we assign seats on the bus, as they do on the airlines, on a first come, first served basis. If you are traveling with friends and signing up separately, be sure to let us know who you are traveling with so that we can seat you next to each other. Single travelers will be given their own seats if space allows or may be seated with another single traveler.

Office Hours - The office is open Monday through Friday between 9:00 AM and 6:00 PM. If you get our voicemail when you call, please leave a message and we will return your call – most times we are in the office but simply on the other line helping another customer.

Goo Cluster, the world's first combination candy bar, a mound of caramel, marshmallow, roasted peanuts and milk chocolate. We will stay for **three nights** at the **magnificent 4-diamond Gaylord Opryland Resort** - words can't describe how beautiful this property is - it has **three enormous, beautifully landscaped atriums** filled with tropical trees, plants, and flowers. Elevated walkways take

you over the landscape for a birds-eye view or take a relaxing stroll on one of the paths among the flowers. You'll have the evening at leisure to explore the Resort. (B,L) **DAY 3** – We'll visit the **Country Music Hall of Fame** which tells the story of country music from its pre-commercial roots in the nineteenth century through its vibrant life today. Nashville and Memphis is known as "Music Highway." Many great artists have called West Tennessee home, including legends such as Carl Perkins, Tina Turner, "Sleepy" John Estes and, of course... Elvis Presley! On our one-hour tour, we'll visit the Tina Turner Museum, John Estes two-room shotgun house, the Queen of Rock, and the Delta 7 regions Country-Blues sound. Our hotel for two nights in Memphis is the **fourdiamond Guest House at Graceland**, located just steps from Graceland. At the Guest House, every aspect of the hotel reflects Elvis Presley's personal design, style and preferences. Celebrate the King of Rock 'n' Roll with the best Elvis tribute artists in the world at the **Ultimate Elvis Tribute Artist Concert**. Past winners of Elvis Presley Enterprises' annual Ultimate Elvis Tribute Artist Contest will perform live on stage at the Graceland Sound Stage. (B) **DAY 6** – Our local guide will take us on a two-hour tour of Memphis to explore the **Soul of Memphis**, a mix of Blues, Swing, Pop and Gospel that was blended by the talents of the early artists in Memphis to the cultural explosion of the



1960's in the neighborhood known as **Soulsville USA**, where **Aretha Franklin** was born, **Al Green** recorded his super hits of the 1970s and **Elvis Presley** snuck into a Baptist church as a teenager to listen to gospel music. We'll learn about the history of the area, how Memphis came to be in the forefront of America's pop music scene, and we'll see the famous march of the Peabody Ducks. We'll spend the afternoon at **Graceland**, beginning with an

included **Premium lunch at Vernon's Smokehouse** that includes Memphis style pork ribs or 18-hour smoked beef brisket. Walk in the King's footsteps on our **audio guided tour of Graceland mansion and grounds**. Explore Elvis' home and follow his amazing journey to music super-stardom through exhibits and museum-quality videos, personal mementos, displays of authentic clothing, an incredible showcase of awards, and more. Experience how the King of Rock 'n' Roll lived as you tour **Graceland mansion**, step aboard his famous **custom jets**, and check out his **collection of cars**. Our **Elvis Experience Tour** includes admission to Graceland Mansion with Audio-Guided Tour & Orientation Film, Self-guided tour of Elvis' Custom Jets, Self-guided tour of Presley Motors Automobile Museum, Self-guided tour of Elvis: The Entertainer Career Museum, Self-guided tours of Elvis Discovery Exhibits and the NEW Immersive and Interactive Experiences! It is the discovery location of musical legends and genres of the 50's from B.B. King and Elvis Presley to Johnny Cash and Jerry Lee Lewis. Our hotel for two nights in Branson is **the Lodge of the Ozarks**. Enjoy an Italian dinner

and the show **Grand Jubilee**, a great show from beginning to end! Headlined by the sensational quartet, New South, this variety show features a wide range of music, including pop, country, gospel, and Top 40 selections. show, **Sight and Sound's** musical theatre production "Jesus," which is performed on a massive 300-foot stage that wraps around the audience. Sight and Sound is known for their massive, authentic sets, special effects and music, and this show has been held over for a second year due to popular demand. Please add \$ 57 for the optional show (B,L) **DAY 9** – We'll depart Branson and head to St Louis, where we will visit **the National Blues Museum** to learn about the Blues' rich history and

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explore aspects of Blues music that many people may not know through songs, film, pictures, and objects. At the Museum at the Gateway Arch, you can trace the story of the Native Americans, explorers, and pioneers who made America possible. Featuring six themed exhibit areas, this innovative and interactive museum celebrates America's pioneering



spirit. **The Gateway Arch** celebrates the westward expansion of the United States and the pioneers who made it possible. We'll be transported **630 feet to the top of the Gateway Arch**, America's tallest monument. Enjoy time for lunch downtown before our return flight with American Airlines. Our flight departs at 11:25 AM, returning to Logan at 3:10 PM, and the

bus will meet us at the airport and bring us back to the Cape. 
